



Poland Spring Country Club

Poland Spring Country Club (The Links at Poland Spring) is a resort golf club established in 1896, and redesigned by Donald Ross in 1913. The Resort, owned and operated by Cynthia Robbins, is steeped in history. The Maine State Golf Hall of Fame is hosted on site in the Maine State Building, which was built for the Columbian Exposition in Chicago in 1896.

The club has a supportive and loyal Membership. About 25,000 rounds are played by Members, Resort Guests, and the public, as well as a dozen or so Outings and MSGA events. The Golf Range, called the Fenn Golf Park, was built in 2012, and has a large and well-maintained grass tee as well as 10 artificial mats. A Gifford's Ice Cream Shop, a mini-golf course, and a disc golf course complete the park.
