2017 U.S. Senior Open Hosted by Salem Country Club

June 26 - July 2, 2017

Salem Country Club, in Peabody, Mass., has been selected to host the 2017 United States Senior Open Championship. This is the second time the club will be showcased across the globe as the host site for the U.S. Senior Open and marks the sixth United States Golf Association (USGA) event to be played at Salem, including the 1954 U.S. Women's Open won by Babe Didrikson Zaharias.

Fifteen years ago, Salem garnered worldwide fame as the host of the 2001 U.S. Senior Open. This championship marked the first time that a Senior Open completely sold out their ticket allotment. With a star studded field including legends of the game such as Gary Player, Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer, it's no surprise the Championship drew over 140,000 spectators from all fifty states.

Former NEPGA Executive Director Eddie Carbone and his team of seasoned golf industry professionals are eager to recreate the magic and memories from the 2001 Championship next summer. The rest of the Championship staff include Mike Goggin, Operations Director; Brianne Wyatt, Volunteer Director; Morgan Goldstein, Marketing and New Media Manager; and Mary LoBello, Sales and Client Services Director. LoBello is no stranger to Salem Country Club as she was part of the 2001 Championship team.
