

Jimmy Noris began golf at the age of thirteen as a caddy at The Country Club in Brookline. He went on to play high school golf at Roslindale High School, becoming the Captain of the team for three years. He won the Boston City School Boy Tournament in 1975.

Jimmy began his professional golf career at The Country Club in Brookline under the mentorship of Don Callahan, working there from 1977 until 1980. He then served as the Assistant Golf Professional at the Essex County Club from 1980 until 1982. He returned to The Country Club as Assistant Golf Professional from 1982 until 1995, spending those winters at Thunderbird Country Club in Rancho Mirage California, again under the mentorship of Don Callahan.

Jimmy was named the Head Golf Professional in 1996 at the Dedham Country and Polo Club in Dedham, Mass. He obtained his dedicated position as Head Golf Professional for twenty-six years until 2021.

Jimmy was actively committed to the New England PGA serving as the co-chair of the Education Committee for four years. He was also chair of the Alcohol and Substance Abuse Committee for eight years. In addition, he served on the Club Relations Committee for ten years.

During Jimmy's tenure, he won the Horton Smith Award and The Mass Chapter Professional of the Year. The following year he won the NEPGA Professional of the Year. Jimmy was very active within the NEPGA, serving as the secretary for two years, then becoming the president of NEPGA from 2011 until 2013. He went on to serve as Honorary President from 2013 until 2015.

Jimmy and his team from Dedham won the Bermuda Good Will Tournament back-to-back years in 1997 and 1998.

Jimmy married his wife beautiful Elaine Wheaton and they have three children; Jimmy Jr., Candice and Courtney. They now have five grandchildren.
