



2018 Vermont PGA Scholarship

Application Requirements

- **A student must have a cumulative GPA of 2.4 (un-weighted GPA based on a 4.0 scale) or higher in either high school or college to be eligible to apply.**
- A student on a full ride from the university (academic or sports) is not eligible as the scholarship can only be applied to tuition, books and lab fees.
- High School seniors will be evaluated on the following ranking percentages:
 - (60%) Cumulative GPA
 - (30%) ACT and/or SAT college test scores
 - (10%) Extracurricular activities
- All college credit whether earned at high school or college level applies to college review and counts towards the cumulative GPA.
- Current college students will be evaluated on the following ranking percentages:
 - (60%) Cumulative GPA
 - (30%) Class level GPA
 - (10%) Extracurricular activities
- Applicants must be children or grandchildren of a PGA member who is in good standing with the Association (the PGA member may be living or deceased).
- Children or grandchildren of Class “F” PGA members are not eligible.
- The scholarship is for first four years only. Students must re-apply each year. (No graduate studies or 5th year under-graduate)
- Any incomplete applications will not be eligible for consideration.
- **The involvement and achievement of the PGA member is not part of the selection criteria.**
- Applicants who are high school seniors must have or plan to complete high school prior to September 1st. They must also be enrolled or planning to enroll as a full time student at an accredited college or university located within the United States. A full time student is defined as one who is taking 12 or more hours in a course of study leading to a traditional associates or baccalaureate degree.
- Students should ensure they are eligible for the scholarship per NCAA Rules, Regulations and Guidelines.
- The scholarship funds are to be used for tuition, books and lab fees **only**.
- The VPGA Scholarship Program is designed to award scholarships. The amount and number of scholarships is determined by the availability of funds, and may vary from year to year based on these factors and IRS guidelines concerning private scholarship foundations. Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the VPGA Scholarship Committee.
- All applications must be in before the **August 15th** deadline to be eligible for fall tuition reimbursement.
- All applications must be accompanied by an I-9 Form to be considered.
