Paul Harney was one of the most accomplished golfers in New England history. He was a regular on the PGA Tour from 1955 to 1962 and had seven official PGA Tour victories during his career, including winning the 1972 Andy Williams San Diego Open while a club professional. Mr. Harney had ten top-10 finishes at The Masters and finished 4th at the U. S. Open at The Country Club in 1963.

Mr. Harney won four straight Massachusetts Opens from 1967 to 1970 and again in 1976 at New Seabury Country Club. He was the National recipient of the 1974 PGA of America's Golf Professional of the Year award, becoming the first national award winner from the New England Section PGA.

Harney, originally from Worcester, Mass., returned to New England to become head professional at Pleasant Valley Country Club from 1964 to 1967 and later went on to own his own namesake golf course in Falmouth, Mass.. He served as president of the New England Section PGA from 1970 to 1973.
