# NEPGA TOURNAMENT NEWS

We start the Tournament News this month by recapping the Pro Senior-Junior Championship that was conducted at Pleasant Valley Country Club on the last day of August. Two teams tied for the Championship, Ron Philo, PGA and Jim Noris, PGA deadlocked with Tom Rooney, PGA and Rusty Gunnarson, PGA at 64. Three other teams trailed the Co-Champions by a single shot, the teams comprised of Steve Demmer, PGA and Rick Karbowski, PGA; John Hickson, PGA and Bob Darling, PGA as well as Troy Pare, PGA and Steve Napoli, PGA who all fired seven under par 65's.

Special thanks to PGA Professional Paul Parajeckas and Superintendent Donnie D'Errico who pulled off a minor miracle by getting the golf course ready for play just days after Hurricane Irene paid a visit to New England. Thanks as well to Mizuno's Matt Mikan and Brent Skinner as well as Antigua and Jeff Dibona for sponsoring.

We also want to recap the fifth and final AHEAD Series event contested at the wonderful Purpoodock Club in Cape Elizabeth, ME. Dan Wilkins, PGA was the low scorer with a brilliant three under par 68, while PGA Professionals Tom Cavicchi and Todd Cook each fired 69. R.J Ziats, PGA, Dan Gillis, PGA and Shawn Warren all finished at one under par 70.

A big thank you to Mike Worroll, PGA and Superintendent Darius lanpour for hosting, and as always, our sponsors, AHEAD's Terry Frechette and Golf Buddy's Cary Gordon.

Purpoodock was the final opportunity to earn one of the 36 spots available in the AHEAD Series Championship. The AHEAD Championship is the first event on the October schedule and will be contested at The Golf Club at Turner Hill on October 4. Additionally, the 36-hole AHEAD Championship is the last chance to earn Wogan points in 2011 and will decide the NEPGA Player of the Year. John Hickson, PGA currently leads the Wogan race, but will not be in the field at Turner Hill. Jeff Martin, PGA and Ron Philo, PGA are both competing, and with a victory can surpass Hickson's total and claim the Player of the Year title.

October means we have entered the wonderful Fall season in New England, the crisp clear air allows for some of the best days of the year for enjoying outdoor activities.

The TaylorMade Head Professional Championship was next on the schedule, hosted by Granite Links Golf Club. The exclusive field was treated to magnificent views of the Boston skyline, summer-like weather and immaculate, yet challenging, course conditions and putting surfaces on the Milton and Quincy nines. Yet no matter how challenging the course and how difficult the set-up, someone always finds a way to get the job done. David Corrado, PGA made one of his rare playing

It doesn't matter whether it is golf equipment, golf cars, or advice on how to operate a golf club, I have the knowledge base to help.

Experience – With my background I worked for some really strong golf professionals who encouraged me by example to get involved. I remember driving to the Section meeting at Hillview GC as an apprentice to see Jim Remy, PGA get elected to NEPGA position of Sec / Treasurer. My goal is to go beyond these base requirements and make sure we offer relevant programs that increase our knowledge in marketing, growing membership, accounting, teaching, and complete golf operations.

**Growing the Game** – I have a Passion for growing the game - First Tee National School Program in VT has over 70 elementary schools and colleges enrolled and we are reaching over 14,000 elementary children in VT. Reaching out to our youngsters is the best way to get to where we need to be in this industry. I didn't do this alone as this happened in VT over a four year period with the help of all the allied golf associations including the Superintendents, Women's Golf Association, and Men's Golf Association. I am fortunate that my father is also the Vermont Golf Association President so it has been a lot of fun working with the VGA hand in hand to make growing the game fun and effective.
