

2021/2022 New Hampshire PGA Scholarship Application Requirements

- A student must have a cumulative GPA of 2.4 (un-weighted GPA based on a 4.0 scale) or higher in either high school or college to be eligible to apply. Students on a Proficiency based grading system must be considered proficient in all curriculum for the grade just completed
- A student on a full ride from the university (academic or sports) is not eligible as the scholarship can only be applied to tuition, books and lab fees
- > High School seniors will be evaluated on the following ranking percentages:
 - o (50%) Cumulative GPA or Proficiency Based Ranking per above
 - o (20%) ACT and/or SAT college test scores
 - o (20%) Extracurricular Activities & Community Service
 - o (10%) Application Content & Accuracy
- All college credit whether earned at high school or college level applies to college review and counts towards the cumulative GPA
- > Current college students will be evaluated on the same ranking as above
- > Applicants must be children or grandchildren of a PGA member who is in good standing with the Association (the PGA member may be living or deceased)
- > Children or grandchildren of Class "F" PGA members are not eligible
- The scholarship is for the first four years only. Students must prove enrollment for following year or semester to be eligible for next year's scholarship award. Any incomplete applications will not be eligible for consideration
- A full-time student is defined as one who is taking 12 or more hours in a course of study leading to a traditional associates or baccalaureate degree.

 \cdot All applications must be in before the June 1, 2021, deadline to be eligible for fall tuition reimbursement and January 1, 2022, for spring tuition reimbursement. \cdot All applications must be accompanied by an I-9 Form to be considered.
